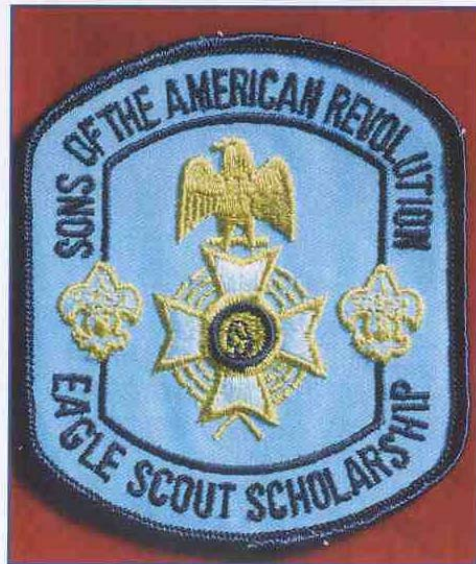

Of the Eagle Scouts submitting an application, one will be judged the winner for the S.A.R. Chapter or BSA Council, and receive this S.A.R. Eagle Scout medal from the Local Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution.



### **SPREADING WINGS DESK-TOP BRONZE EAGLE TROPHY**

The Chapter winner's application will be submitted to the State Society to join other Chapter winners in the State, and the winner of that judging will receive this handsome trophy from the State Society at their annual meeting or suitable ceremony.

Dear Eagle Scout:

**The members of the Spirit of St. Louis Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution wish to extend our congratulations on attaining the coveted Eagle Scout Award. You have reached a height to which many aspire, but few attain.**

Your achievement in earning the Eagle Scout Award is a milestone in your life. You now have an opportunity to receive (1) a special Eagle Scout Patch, (2) a NSSAR Eagle Scout Medal, (3) a Spreading Wings desktop Bronze Eagle Trophy, and (4) an \$10,000 cash Scholarship for the first place winner, a \$6,000 cash Scholarship for the Runner-up, or a \$4,000 cash Scholarship for the 2<sup>nd</sup> place Runner-up.

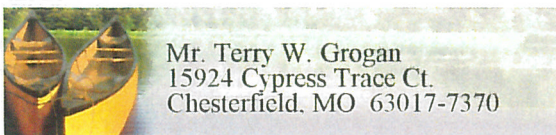
The National Society Sons of the American Revolution (NSSAR), comprised of descendants of those who served in uniform or rendered material aid to the founding of the United States of America, is dedicated to fostering the principles of the Founding Fathers. Those achieving the rank of Eagle Scout have demonstrated their belief in those same principles and the Society feels that they are deserving of special recognition for their accomplishments and dedication.

To be eligible, you must have passed the Eagle Scout Board of Review, be currently registered in an active unit and have not reached your 19<sup>th</sup> birthday during the year of application. You may apply in more than one year if you meet the age requirement but no more than \$8,000 total may be granted to any one Eagle Scout. To qualify, your completed application, four-generation chart and theme should be mailed to the address below so it is received no later than DECEMBER 15th.

Complete the attached application with introductory information and items I through VIII. Complete item IX, your ancestor chart, as best you can, and prepare item X, a patriotic theme of 500 words or less. The patriotic theme will be evaluated on historical accuracy, originality, composition and neatness. The forms may also be obtained at the NSSAR web site, <http://www.sar.org/youth/eagle.htm>.

- **EAGLE SCOUT PATCH:** Each Eagle Scout submitting the scholarship application, 4 generation chart and the 500 word or less Patriotic Theme will receive this special Patch free.
- **NSSAR EAGLE SCOUT MEDAL:** Of the Eagle Scouts submitting applications, one will be judged the winner for the Spirit of St. Louis Chapter and will receive the NSSAR Eagle Scout Medal at one of our regular monthly meetings.
- **SPREADING WINGS DESKTOP BRONZE EAGLE TROPHY:** The Chapter winner's application will be submitted to the Missouri Society Sons of the American Revolution for judging at the state level, and the winner of that judging will receive the handsome Trophy at the April Missouri State Convention. The State winner will be awarded a \$300 cash scholarship by the Missouri State Society.
- **NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP AND TRIP:** The State winner's application will then be submitted to the National Society as a candidate for the \$10,000 cash scholarship and a trip to the July Sons of the American Revolution Congress (annual convention). The 2<sup>nd</sup> place winner will receive \$6,000 and the 3<sup>rd</sup> place winner will receive \$4,000 cash scholarships.

## Sons of the American Revolution

The Patriotic Theme should be approximately five-hundred words or less. Some suggestions you may want to use for your theme follow:

Signer of Declaration of Independence

Military or naval service

Battle of Point Pleasant, October 10, 1774

Service from April 19, 1775 to November 26, 1783

Civil service under the Colonies from April 19, 1775 to

November 26, 1783, inclusive Patriotic service by men or women during the Revolutionary period including - Member of committees made necessary by the war, such as Committee of Correspondence, Inspection and Safety; Committee to care for soldiers' families; including Committees from six months before the Battle of Point Pleasant which furthered the cause of the Colonies.

Any pledge to support the cause of the Colonies, such as signing the Oath of Fidelity and Support, the Oath of Allegiance, Articles of Association, or the Association Test.

Members of all Continental Congresses.

Furnishing a substitute for military service.

Signers of Mecklenburg Declaration, 1775; Albemarle, Virginia Declaration; and similar declarations. Signers of petitions addressed to and recognizing the authority of the provisional and new state governments. Persons accepting obligations or acting under direction of the provisional and new state governments, such as persons directed to hold elections, to oversee road construction, to collect provisions, etc.

Members of Boston Tea Party; Kaskaskia Campaign; Galvez Expedition; Cherokee Expedition; Edenton Tea Party.

Physician, Surgeon, nurse or others rendering aid to the wounded and ministers known to be in sympathy with the Colonies, either by sermon, speech or action.

Defenders of forts and frontiers; Rangers.

Prisoners of war, including those on British ship "Old Jersey" and other prison ships.

Rendering material aid, such as furnishing supplies with or without remuneration; lending money to the colonies, munitions makers and gunsmiths; or anything which furthered the Cause.

A battle or campaign during the Revolution, Valley Forge; some interesting episode in the life of an ancestor.

## *Suggested Criteria for Judging the NSSAR Eagle Scout Scholarship Application*

**Section I. Max 10 Points: Leadership Responsibilities:** Consider leadership positions held and relative importance: i.e., Senior Patrol Leader should count for more points than Scribe.

**Section II. Max 12 Points: Merit Badges:** Give three points for each of the specific merit badges of Genealogy, Law, and American Heritage; and one point for each five Merit Badges beyond the 21 required for Eagle Scout up to the maximum of 12 points in this category. (5 Merit Badges in excess of the 21 are required for a Palm).

**Section III. Max. 10 Points: Scouting Activities:** Evaluate activity participation, giving greater weight to the most significant: i.e., a National Jamboree is more significant than a District or Council Camporee; a 50-Miler is more significant than a Merit Badge Show.

**Section IV. No points: Hobbies & Leisure Time:** Study to evaluate the depth of the Scout's interests and talents that go beyond the ordinary. This may become a factor when considering candidates of otherwise equal achievement for a "tie-breaker."

**Section V. Max. 10 Points: Community Activities:** Evaluate applicant's involvement and achievements outside Scouting, his Religion and School. In this section, disregard any Scouting, Religious, and School activities repeated in Section III, VI, and VII.

**Section VI. Max. 10 Points: Religious Activities:** Look particularly for Religious Awards earned and the depth of his faith as shown by his Activities, Participation and Leadership.

**Section VII. Max 10 Points: School Activities:** Evaluate applicant in both Scholastic and Extracurricular Activities; his leadership and recognition related to his School, Honor Roll, Dean's List, Beta Club, Athletic achievements; Student Government leadership should carry weight.

**Section VIII. Max 8 Points: Other Awards:** If the applicant lists awards and recognitions such as the BSA Hornaday Award, Lifesaving Award, Citizenship Awards by the American Legion or DAR, or ROTC, this gives the opportunity to give the maximum points allowed.

**Section IX. Max 10 Points: Ancestor Chart:** Proper format, complete data and neatness should be considered for the most points allowed. Showing generation information beyond the four generations requested should be credited. If the applicant is an immigrant, orphaned or adopted and has provided information substantiating his status, and provides what information is available to him, use your judgment in awarding points.

**Section X. Max 20 Points: Patriotic Theme:** Evaluate theme on its historical accuracy, originality, composition, Spelling, clarity of expression, sentence structure, and bibliography. Deduct points if theme significantly exceeds the 500 word minimum.

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We realize that there will be variations between the interpretation and award of points by different judges. This is to be expected, but if each judge will adhere to the same criteria in reviewing each application without prejudice, we can expect a fair evaluation and the ultimate selection of the most deserving winner at every level of competition.



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
